1. Basic Information

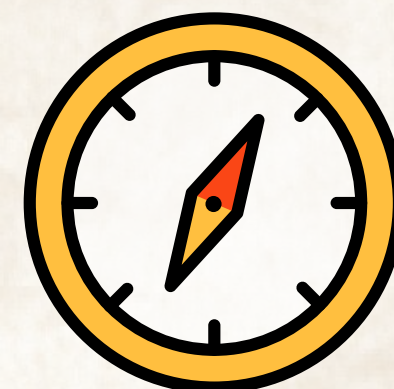
- What are the start and end dates of your current IEP?

3. Goals and Objectives

4. Accommodations and Modifications

- Locate the accommodations and modifications section of your IEP. Identify two accommodations that are listed to support your learning.

5. Special Education Services

- What school subjects do you get help with based on your IEP? (Math, Reading, Science etc.)



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6. Transition Planning

- Locate the section in your IEP that discusses your plans for life after high school. What goals or activities are included in this section?

- What support or services do you have to help you make a successful transition from high school to adulthood?

- What additional services or supports would you like to add to your IEP to help you plan for your future and successfully transition to adulthood?

7. Parent and Teacher Communication

Helpful Hint: look for the meeting notes, parent input, or general information section

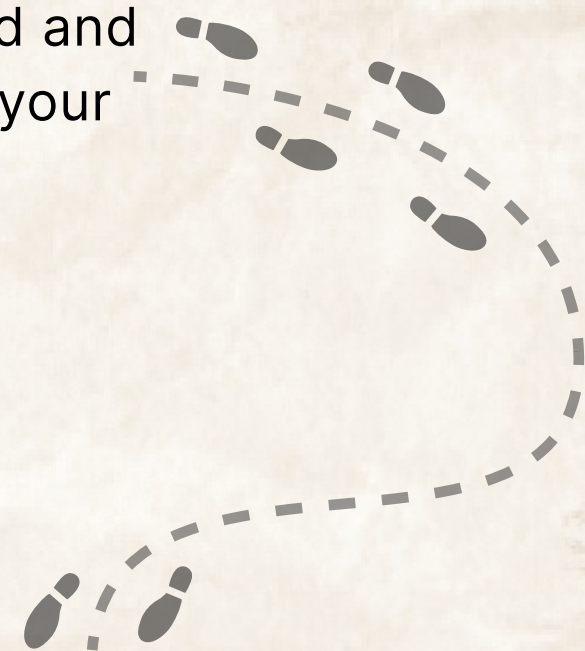


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8. Assessment and Evaluation

- How will your progress towards your goals be measured and recorded? What tools or methods will be used to track your progress (e.g., tests, observations, work samples)?



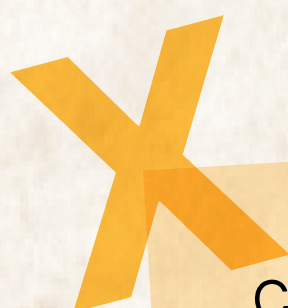
9. Review and Revision
